




Introduction





the notebook.


Scouting Team: In competitions, we go around and write down the basic idea of what each robot can do.






Together We Succeed


Even though we are all different in our own way, we cooperate and compromise.



Sally Ride, the first female American to be sent to space






Sally Ride Inspires

Not only did she influence people globally, she created many programs to help not only girls but all students. Sally Ride started the Sally Ride Science that encouraged female students to be engaged in STEM.








learning about them.


Perspectives We Glimpse

After meeting these new people, we learn about them and their cultures, which helps us develop the ability to see from other people's perspectives.


C.H.E.P. Leads Us To Diversity
